joining the Foreign Mission Committee and the Lottie T. Young Missionary Society. (The latter two are now known as Norma L. Burruss Foreign Mission Ministry and the Lottie T. Young State Mission Ministry.)

The Home Mission Ministry is unique. We are not just a caring, spiritually supportive ministry. Rather, we also seek to be aware of many basic and emergency needs, which we regularly seek to address.

We seek to maintain an acceptable quality of life for members of the congregation and for members of the local community. When urgent needs emerge, we use a "phone tree" or an email communication system to make decisions and to facilitate needed responses.

Much of our interchurch ministry involves efforts to keep open spiritual and caring communication with those with special needs, as well as with our seasoned citizens and those who are physically, mentally, and emotionally challenged.

**We stress inclusion**, using not only our committee members but continuing efforts to form partner-

ships with other churches and community service providers.

Our programs are also intergenerational, including both youth groups and young adults. We consider this not only a valuable resource but also

a training ground that can assure the ongoing stability, consistency, and productive evolution of our ministry.

Our operating funds come from designated gifts in the offering plate each Sunday as well as on-line. We are blessed because we receive generous donations from members of the church, their families, and persons in the community who are supportive of our mission.

Many who have been assisted in the past also later reciprocate by making financial contributions that enable us to continue our efforts in Christ's name for the benefit of many.
